A RESOLUTION OF THE LEE COUNTY METROPOLITAN PLANNING ORGANIZATION: POLICY STATEMENT ON A BALANCED MULTI-MODAL TRANSPORTATION SYSTEM

WHEREAS, in December 2010, the Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) will complete the 2035 Long Range Transportation (LRTP) plan, and

WHEREAS, the LRTP demonstrates that funding for transportation improvements are severely limited in the upcoming 25-year time horizon, and

WHEREAS, the MPO desires a world-class, balanced, and multimodal transportation system that has the capacity to move people and goods in a cost-efficient and effective way.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the *Lee County Metropolitan Organization* that the MPO will maximize the use of existing transportation facilities and explore opportunities for improved connectivity before adding new facilities to the MPO's Plans.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that to facilitate the shift to a more balanced multi-modal transportation system, the MPO board directs its staff and committees to develop an integrated prioritization approach. The MPO further directs its staff and committees to develop a priority list of projects to submit to the Florida Department of Transportation on an annual basis beginning in June 2011. This list shall include at a minimum, public transit, roads, bicycle and pedestrian facilities, congestion management, safety, and traffic operations projects.

A RESOLUTION OF THE LEE COUNTY METROPOLITAN PLANNING ORGANIZATION: POLICY ON MAJOR LRTP UPDATE

WHEREAS, the Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) will complete its 2035 Long Range Transportation Plan in December 2010, and

WHEREAS, the MPO board, staff, and committees recognize the need for additional analyses to be conducted that will accurately represent Lee County's transportation needs in the 25-year timeframe, and

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the *Lee County Metropolitan Planning Organization* that the MPO Board intends to develop a major update and revision to the 2035 LRTP by the conclusion of the 2012 calendar year.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the MPO Board directs its staff and committees to update the LRTP based on data from the United States 2010 Census, the Lee County Evaluation and Appraisal Report (EAR) and related amendments, the Lee County Transit Division's updated 10-year plan, the MPO's Rail Feasibility Study and incorporation of any other studies on transit and rail transportation, and the final report of the Alternative Transportation in Parks and Public Lands Program (ATPPL) study.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the 2035 LRTP update will utilize new modeling techniques that will provide scenario analysis and options and will utilize innovative public participation techniques.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the 2035 LRTP update will incorporate performance measures that will measure and track progress toward goals.
